VOTE ELECTION 2024

THE 2024 UNIVERSAL CITY
GENERAL ELECTION WILL BE
CONDUCTED ON MAY 4, 2024.

Election preparations begin in the early months of 2024 long before a registered voter can cast his/her ballot for elected city officials. For candidates, the process begins when qualified city residents file their candidate applications for a place on the Universal City ballot.

Three City Council seats and the Mayor's seat will be considered on the May 4, 2024 ballot, the outcome determining the 2024-2026 terms. Councilmember Steven Buck, Councilmember Paul Najarian, Councilmember Phil Vaughan, and Mayor John Williams currently hold these seats.

The candidate filing period begins Wednesday, January 17, 2024. Candidates may file with the City Clerk during office hours, Monday-Friday, 8:00 A.M. - 5:00 P.M. The deadline to file for a place on the ballot is Friday, February 16, 2024, by 5:00 P.M. A \$20.00 filing fee or a petition in lieu of the filing fee must accompany the candidate's application at the time of its filing with the City Clerk's office during the filing period. A candidate's application, including an accompanying petition (if applicable), is public information immediately at the time of its filing.

CANDIDATE QUALIFICATIONS
Texas statutes and the City Charter define the requirements for candidates seeking public office. To be eligible to be a candidate for a public elective office, a person must:

- Be a U.S. citizen;
- Have resided continuously in the State of Texas for twelve (12) months and in the City of Universal City for six (6) months immediately preceding the date of the regular filing deadline for a candidate's application for a place on the ballot;
- Be eighteen (18) years of age or older on the first day of term to be filled;
- Be a registered voter at the time of taking office (Registered Voter means a person registered to vote in this state whose registration is effective);
- Not have been determined mentally incompetent by a final judgment of a court;
- Not have been convicted of a felony from which the person has not been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disabilities.

Candidate election packets will be available online at uctx.gov or for pick-up at the City Clerk's office in City Hall. City Hall is located at 2150 Universal City Blvd, Universal City, TX 78148.



WARRANT RESOLUTION ASSISTANCE

In March, the Universal City Municipal Court is set to participate in Warrant Resolution, joining numerous Texas law enforcement agencies in this initiative. Universal City aims to assist individuals in resolving any outstanding warrants to prevent potential arrests. According to Texas Law, individuals appearing before a court and sincerely attempting to resolve outstanding Class C cases are granted safe harbor and are not subject to arrest.

Those who suspect they may have an active warrant are strongly encouraged to reach out for assistance.

They can contact Perdue, Brandon, Fielder, Collins, and Mott, LLP at (800) 994-0676 or the Universal City Municipal Court at (210) 619-0716 to address and rectify their case.

The Municipal Court office, located at 2150 Universal City Blvd, operates Monday through Thursday from 7 am to 6 pm. This proactive approach aims to help individuals resolve their legal matters and avoid potential legal consequences.

RESIDENTIAL BRUSH REMOVAL

WM COLLECTS RESIDENTIAL BRUSH FOUR TIMES A YEAR IN UNIVERSAL CITY.

MARK YOUR CALENDARS FOR THE FOLLOWING 2024 BRUSH COLLECTION DATES:

- 1st: Monday, March 25, 2024
- 2nd: Monday, April 22, 2024
- 3rd: Monday, October 28, 2024
- 4th: Monday, November 25, 2024

TO ENSURE YOU DO NOT MISS THE TRUCK WHEN IT COME TO YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD, PLEASE REVIEW THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES.

VERY IMPORTANT!

All brush for collection must be at the curb by Monday at 7AM of the scheduled pickup week.

Residents may begin placing brush at the curb for pickup on the Wednesday prior to collection date. Example: For the Monday, March 25th collection, residents may begin placing brush curbside as early as Wednesday, March 20th.

Waste Management will begin collecting brush on Monday and work their way through the City collecting brush during the week. Once the collection truck leaves your area, it will not return so please have all brush curbside by the Monday scheduled to ensure you do not miss the collection.


In the event that WM does not collect all your bags/brush, they will return. Quite often, the collection trucks fill up and they will have to return with an empty one to continue the route.

Please review the following procedures to prepare your brush for pickup. If brush is not bagged and bundled properly, WM will not collect it.

Brush collection is limited to 6 cubic yards in total including both bags of leaves and bundles of limbs.

Branches and limbs must be cut to 4ft. in length, no thicker than 6in. in diameter and bundled. **Loose branches will not be picked up.** WM workers lift branches into the trucks by hand. If they are not cut properly, they will not be able to collect.

BUNDLING LIMBS FOR BRUSH COLLECTION



Trees trimmed by a tree service company will not be picked up. Before hiring a company, ensure they will remove the brush at completion of the job. Leaves should be bagged and weigh no more than thirty-five (35) pounds per bag. Trash bags should only contain leaves, grass clippings, and other similar materials. Rocks, gravel, and soil should not be placed in trash bags. Small trimmings and grass clippings can also go in the twice weekly trash carts year-round.

OAK WILT

OAK WILT IS A DEVASTATING TREE DISEASE THAT HAS KILLED MILLIONS OF OAKS IN THE UNITED STATES.

It is caused by a fungus that invades and blocks the water-conducting system of the tree. All oaks can be infected with oak wilt, but some species of oak are more susceptible than others. The best time to prune is when a contaminated beetle is least likely to find your tree. The heat of summer and the cold of winter are when the beetle populations are the lowest and fungal mats are least likely to form. Therefore that is the best time to prune to prevent against an oak wilt infection.

HOW TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF OAK WILT

Oak wilt spreads to other oak trees in two ways – long distances with the aid of certain beetles or locally through common or grafted roots.

Here are some tips to help prevent the spread of Oak Wilt:

- Avoid pruning or wounding oak trees during the spring and early summer (February 1-July 1). This is when sap beetles are most active and can spread the fungus.
- Sterilize/Sanitize all pruning equipment between trees using denatured methyl alcohol (shellac thinner), isopropyl alcohol, or a general-purpose household disinfectant such as Lysol, Listerine, Pine-Sol or related products. Using household bleach is NOT

recommended as it can be corrosive to pruning tools as well as people.

- If you must prune oak trees, do so during the dormant season (late fall or winter).
- Be careful not to damage oak trees with lawnmowers, weed trimmers, or other equipment.
- Immediately paint all wounds on oaks to prevent contact with contaminated beetles. Wounds should be painted, regardless of the time of year they were made, with commercial tree wound dressing or latex paint (color doesn't matter!). Wounds can be either man made or natural and include freshly cut stumps and damaged surface roots.

HOW TO TREAT OAK WILT

There is no cure for oak wilt, but there are treatments that can slow the spread of the disease and save some trees. Treatment options include:

- **Fungicides**
Fungicides can be applied to the soil around infected trees to help prevent the fungus from spreading to other trees.

- **Trenching**
Trenching can be used to create a barrier between infected trees and healthy trees. This can help to prevent the fungus from spreading through the roots.

- **Tree removal**
In some cases, it may be necessary to remove infected trees to prevent the spread of the disease.

CRIME PREVENTION



REDUCE VEHICLE BREAK-INS

Breaking into vehicles has become organized and systematized by criminals. These loose organizations flood into an area, hit as many vehicles as possible, then quickly move on into the next neighborhood or city. Unfortunately, lack of awareness by vehicle owners is their predominant means of success.

Many news stories lately have had discussions on whether to lock or unlock the vehicle doors. Whichever method you choose, there remain further steps that can be taken to reduce the likelihood of being burglarized. If you choose to lock your vehicle's doors, consider tapered interior door lock buttons, and activate vehicle's alarm system. Though not foolproof, such devices can act as strong deterrents.

To reduce the likelihood that your vehicle is burglarized, following some simple rules will drastically make a difference:

- Park in heavily traveled and lighted areas when away from home.
- At home, park the vehicle in your driveway near a light source. In apartment complexes, park as close as possible to the apartment and under or near a light.

The most effective means to thwart vehicle burglaries is an empty vehicle.

Protect yourself, your valuables, and your automobile.

Don't leave any valuables in sight; better yet, remove valuables. Ultimately, the intent of the criminals is to search the vehicles for valuables. Specific items of value are as follows:

GUNS AND RIFLES

Trucks and larger vehicles tend to be a target for thieves looking for guns and rifles. They also know when it is hunting season and take advantage of that.

ELECTRONICS, ESPECIALLY LAPTOPS AND CELLPHONES

If you frequently commute with a laptop or tablet, set a reminder to take them inside the house each evening.

Wallets, purses, credit/debit cards, cash, checkbooks, and purchase receipts.

ANY ITEM WITH YOUR NAME, ADDRESS, PHONE NUMBER, DATE OF BIRTH, OR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER

Proof of car insurance and registration of vehicles can be accessed via websites and mobile apps. Keep your original documents safe inside the house.

KEYS LEFT IN THE CAR OR SPARE KEYS HID IN THE CAR

Don't hide them in the vehicle - they can easily be found. When your vehicle is in for service or repairs, remove all valuables and leave only the ignition key for the attendant. The trunk IS NOT a safe place to store valuables. Most vehicles have access to the trunk from the driver's compartment. So, if they can get in your car they can get into your trunk.


