VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE: TUESDAY, OCTOBER 10, 2023

Your vote is contagious! Share your enthusiasm for voting with friends, family, and neighbors. Encourage them to register if they haven't already and help them understand the importance of participating in the democratic process. When more voices come together, we create a stronger, more inclusive society.

EARLY VOTING DATES: OCTOBER 23 - NOVEMBER 3, 2023

GIVING OUR PLANET A HIGH-FIVE FOR BEING AWESOME.

Recycling reduces the amount of waste thrown in landfills. Imagine those landfills as giant piles of trash taking up valuable space. Recycling helps shrink those piles, making neighborhoods cleaner and less stinky.

But it's not just about space. Recycling also saves energy. Think about making things from scratch, like paper or aluminum cans. It takes a ton of energy and resources to do that. But when people recycle, items are being reused, so we do not have to start from square one. That saves energy, and when we save energy, we help the environment by reducing pollution and slowing down climate change. Plus, recycling conserves natural resources such as trees, minerals, and oil.

Non-recyclable items contaminate recyclables. Recyclables stuck inside plastic grocery or trash bags are at risk of never making it through the recycling process. Conversely, recyclable items placed into garbage containers are hauled to a landfill and cannot be recovered effectively. The right thing to do is put the right recyclables in the recycling container and non-recyclables into garbage containers.

The next time you toss that soda can into the recycling bin or remember to recycle old newspapers, know that you are helping keep the planet cleaner, conserving resources, and saving energy. Give yourself a high-five!

For Universal City residents, WM provides a green cart with a yellow lid for recycling. Recyclables with the greatest impact are bottles, cans, paper, and cardboard. Make sure to use this cart for recyclable items only such as:

- **PLASTIC BOTTLES AND CONTAINERS** - Recycle plastics by shape: bottles, jars, jugs, and tubs. The "chasing arrows" symbol doesn't necessarily mean it's recyclable. Clean and dry containers, then put the cap back on before tossing in the bin.
- **FOOD AND BEVERAGE CANS** - Recycle empty tin, aluminum, and steel cans. Empty aerosol cans are also recyclable. If the can has a plastic lid, remove it before recycling.
- **PAPER** - Paper, newspaper and magazines are good to recycle. If paper is soiled or wet, put it in the trash bin.
- **FLATTENED CARDBOARD AND PAPERBOARD** - Flatten and recycle all cardboard and paperboard. Cardboard pizza delivery boxes without leftovers should be recycled; but leftover crusts, cheese, and other foods should not.
- **FOOD AND BEVERAGE CONTAINERS** - Plastic containers #1-#7 are acceptable for recycling as well as glass bottles, tin, steel, and aluminum cans. Make sure containers are completely empty to avoid contamination.

BRUSH REMOVAL

**THE LAST 2023 CURBSIDE BRUSH COLLECTION:
OCTOBER 23, 2023 & NOVEMBER 27, 2023**



To ensure you do not miss the truck when it come to your neighborhood, please review the following guidelines.

- **VERY IMPORTANT! All brush for collection must be at the curb by Monday at 7AM of the scheduled pickup week.**
- Residents may begin placing brush at the curb for pickup on the Wednesday prior to collection date. Example: For the Monday, October 23rd collection, residents may begin placing brush curbside as early as Wednesday, October 18th.
- Waste Management will begin collecting brush on Monday and work their way through the City collecting brush during the week. Once the collection truck leaves your area, it will not return so please have all brush curbside by the Monday scheduled to ensure you do not miss the collection.
- In the event that WM does not collect all your bags/brush, they will return. Quite often, the collection trucks fill up and they will have to return with an empty one to continue the route.

Please review the following procedures to prepare your brush for pickup. If brush is not bagged and bundled properly, WM will not collect it.

- Brush collection is limited to 6 cubic yards in total including both bags of leaves and bundles of limbs.
- Branches and limbs must be cut to 4ft. in length, no thicker than 6in. in diameter and bundled. Loose branches will not be picked up. WM workers lift branches into the trucks by hand. If they are not cut properly, they will not be able to collect.
- Trees trimmed by a tree service company will not be picked up. Before hiring a company, ensure they will remove the brush at completion of the job.
- Leaves should be bagged and weigh no more than thirty-five (35) pounds per bag. Trash bags should only contain leaves, grass clippings, and other similar materials. Rocks, gravel, and soil should not be placed in trash bags. Small trimmings and grass clippings can also go in the twice weekly trash carts year-round.
- If your brush is not prepared correctly, WM will not pick it up and will leave a tag indicating why it was not collected.

PINK TAGS: Residents who have occasional excessive trash and yard waste can purchase pink tags for \$2.14 (includes fee and tax) at City Hall which allows for the extra bags to be picked up by WM. One pink tag per bag; cannot be used for bulky items such as mattresses, furniture, etc. or hazardous waste.


