The Randolph Composite Squadron of the Civil Air Patrol, an auxiliary of the U.S. Air Force, is composed of cadets ages 12-17 and adult senior members. The squadron marched in the Fiesta Flambeau Parade and is planning a trip to the NASA Johnson Space Center in July 2023. Meetings are held weekly where cadets learn about aerospace, leadership, and other skills. There are also many opportunities for special events to learn about emergency services, search and rescue, and much more.

Founded in 1941 and established as the official civilian auxiliary of the U.S. Air Force seven years later, Civil Air Patrol (CAP) is chartered by Congress as a nonprofit organization for the purposes of youth development, aerospace education, and to promote general aviation. In an auxiliary role as a Total Force partner of the Air Force, CAP operates the world's largest fleet of single-engine aircraft for search and rescue, disaster relief, training, and education. Civil Air Patrol is dedicated to serving America's communities, saving lives, and shaping futures.

MENTAL HEALTH UNIT

The United States is currently facing a mental health crisis with millions of Americans suffering from various mental health disorders. According to the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), approximately 1 in 5 adults in the United States experience mental illness each year. This equates to around 43.8 million people. The mental health crisis is exacerbated by a lack of access to mental health services, stigma surrounding mental illness, and a shortage of mental health professionals. Many individuals who require mental health services are unable to access them due to financial barriers or are unaware of the resources in their area.



The Universal City Police Department recognizes these issues and has assembled a group of dedicated officers to create the department's first Mental Health Unit. Mental Health Officers have access to resources in the Bexar County / San Antonio area and can deploy them to Universal City citizens. Mental Health Officers are able to establish connections with Be Well Texas Substance Abuse Center, Endeavors Family & Veteran assistance, Grace Community Church, and Schertz EMS Mobile Integrated Health.

Mental Health Officers assist with Crisis Intervention in situations such as individuals having thoughts of harming themselves or others, Substance Abuse from Narcotics or Alcohol, homeless or transient individuals that need assistance finding housing, or addressing any other mental health needs.

At times, Mental Health Officers must conduct what is called a Warrantless Emergency Detention. An Emergency Detention is an authority granted by the State of Texas where a peace officer may place an individual into their custody who is a danger to themselves or others, and transport them to the closest mental health facility for an evaluation of their mental health.

It is the mission of the Universal City Police Department Mental Health Unit to provide excellence in service by facilitating the most appropriate level of care and intervention based on an individual's mental health needs.

PREVENT THE PARADE OF PESTS

The best offense is defense. Though this phrase is typically attributed to sports or war, it is even more true when it comes to keeping those pesky unwanted guests out of your home. No, this does not mean running interference to keep the in-laws away from the annual Fourth of July celebration, think smaller. Yes, those tiny, sometimes furry, always intrusive invaders that tend to sneak in through the cracks and crevices of your home. Pests may come in many different shapes and sizes but with a little extra effort, they can be tackled before they cross the threshold of a home. As with humans, buildings tend to pick up bumps and bruises as they age and need a little extra attention or doctoring to keep them going for many years to come.

It is important when looking for pests to think like them. Seal or caulk holes around the outside of the house around light fixtures, vents, siding, or trim around the doors and windows. If the home has brick, keep the holes at the bottom of the wall near the foundation open. These holes are important to allow any moisture that may build up between in the air space between the wall and the brick to run out ensuring the walls stay dry. Putting a small amount of mineral wool in these holes will help keep larger insects or snakes from deciding that they have the right to free load. Inside, take similar steps by checking all the perimeter walls of the home and caulking around the windows, door frames, and even under sinks where the drains and water lines come in through the walls.

Rake back soil or mulch from the foundation allowing about 3 inches of exposed concrete below the siding, brick, or stucco


on the home. This helps prevent moisture from getting close to the bottom plate of the walls and provides a way to clearly see any possible trails from ants or termites as those covert operators attempt to sneak in. Paint, stain, or seal any exposed or raw wood on the house or deck to avoid tunneling termites.

Check any attic, soffit, skirting, or bathroom and kitchen exhaust vents or screens to make sure they are undamaged. Dryer vents should never have screens in them as the lint build up could lead to fires and cause dryers to work improperly due to minimal or no airflow. These vents should be cleaned at least twice a year from top to bottom, not only to prevent fires but because lint filled vents tend to attract rodents, snakes, or other nest builders. Typically, the hot air from the dryer is a deterrent for pests but if the line is filled with lint preventing that air from escaping all they see is a safe tunnel filled with free nesting material.

Mosquitos love standing or still water. Empty any buckets or containers around the property and make sure pools have fully functional pumps and are treated regularly. Fill in any holes around the yard that could collect water with soil to ensure adequate drainage away from the house and any other buildings around the property.

Coupling these tactics with routine pest control measures around the home will ensure that those villainous vermin will be dead in the water before they can slink in and take advantage of the hospitality granted to the very welcome guests daily.


Universal City Park is home to the City's largest pavilion. The pavilion is 7,000 sq. ft. and has 10 picnic tables with barbeque pits located around the perimeter. Basketball courts are also located on the pavilion. Universal City Park features a playground, softball field, 2 baseball fields, 2 tee-ball fields, sand volleyball courts, basketball court, 3 pickleball courts, a football field, disc golf course, and a walking trail. Universal City Park is located at 305 North Blvd.

Red Horse Park features a 2,200 sq. ft. pavilion. The pavilion has 8 picnic tables with a very large barbeque pit. A beautiful, paved walking trail with workout stations and large shade trees circle the entire park. It also features several covered picnic areas, outdoor classroom, 2 separate playgrounds, and a softball field. It is also home to the Heroes Walk 9/11 Memorial. Red Horse Park is located at 1100 North Blvd.



Northview Park features a playground and 3 story slide tower, a paved walking trail, and Splashpad. This park is located at 100 Randolph Plaza, adjacent to the City Library.

Northview Splashpad is located at 100 Randolph Plaza at the Northview Park. Open daily April through October. It includes 16 water features spread throughout a 4,000 sq. ft. pad which are controlled by a timing system. The Splashpad is free and open to the public from 10AM to 8PM. Three pavilions are available for party rentals. Please visit the website www.UCTX.gov for rules and additional information.



Aina Blake Dog Park is located at 134 Athenian Drive. This 1.3-acre dog park is an off-leash park which features shades structures, water stations, waste disposal facilities, and separate play areas for large dogs and small dogs. This park is extremely popular with all dog lovers.

Veterans Park is an 8-acre park with mature trees and a scenic view along Cibolo Creek dedicated to the members of the Armed Forces. Play in the open area or the brand-new playground. Take a walk and use the workout stations along the paved trail which connects to Universal City Park. Have a picnic and reserve one of the many pavilions featuring tables, a barbeque grill, and lights. Benches and paving stones are available to honor your military hero. Veterans Park is located at 737 E. Aviation by Cibolo Creek.



Meadow Oaks Park at 51 Meadowland Dr. is a one-acre park consisting of an updated playground, pavilion with barbeque pit, and a basketball court.

BASIC PARK RULES:

- No glass containers.
- Regular hours for all Universal City parks are 6AM – 11PM.
- Pet owners must clean up after their pet promptly and properly.
- Pets must remain on a leash and are not permitted on any ball field.
- Speed limit in the parks is 10 mph. No parking allowed in the grass areas.
- Smoke-free enviroment
- Park pavilions, clubhouse, and ball fields are available for reservation. Visit www.UCTX.gov to make your reservation online.

Disc Golf Course is located at Universal City Park and runs along Cibolo Creek. Installed in 2001 with the assistance of the Alamo City Disc Golf Club, the course challenges all level of players with diverse types of terrain and settings.

Cimarron Clubhouse is 1,200 sq. ft. and has a kitchen, restrooms, 10 aluminum folding tables and 60 chairs. The clubhouse has a new playground and parking lot with a 15-car capacity. Cimarron Clubhouse is located at 368 Wagon Crossing.

The Cibolo Creek Linear Park Trails stretch from Universal City Park and Red Horse Park to Veterans Park off E. Aviation. The trails offer different degrees of difficulty but if you are up for the challenge, it is rewarding. The main trail is just over 3 miles round trip with several smaller primitive trails for those looking for an adventure.


